OLD-FASHIONED FUN

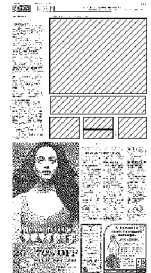

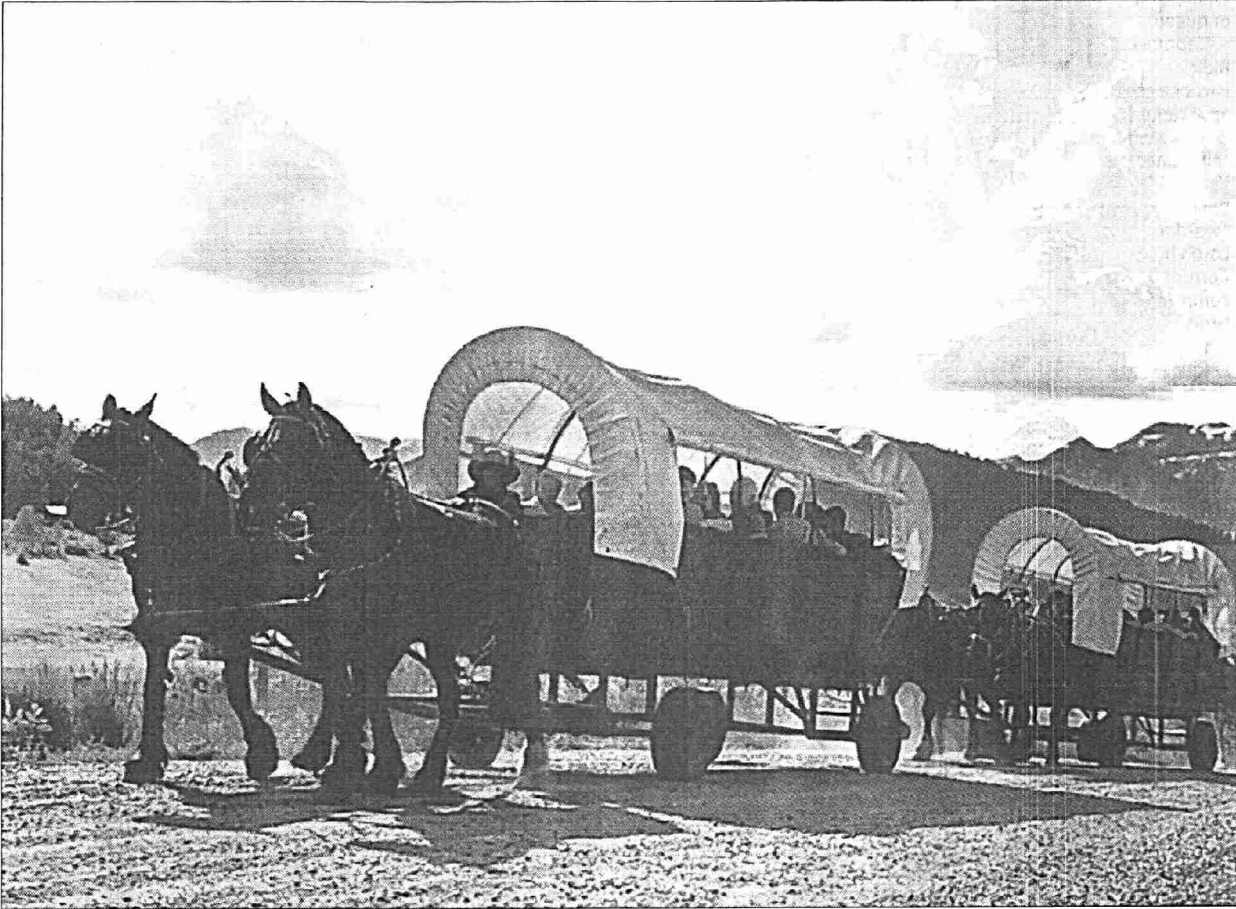
