Wyoming Inn offers wagon train dinner experience with Jackson Hole history

Each summer visitors come to Jackson Hole seeking the authentic Western experience. The Wyoming Inn treats families to a real-West piece of Jackson Hole history with an opportunity to travel by wagon train to a Dutch-oven dinner and cowboy show—uniquely Western fun for visitors of all ages. Created by the Bar-T-Five—descendants of Jackson Hole character “Uncle Nick” Wilson, who brought one of the first wagon trains over Teton Pass into Jackson Hole in 1889 (the town of Wilson is named for him)—the Wagon Train Dinner includes a horse-drawn covered wagon ride up Cache Creek Canyon to a camp where a Dutch-oven dinner of chicken and roast beef and a cowboy band await guests.

“Jackson Hole offers so much to see and do, our guests sometimes worry about how to pack it all in,” says Wyoming Inn general manager Ed Krajsky. “We offer one-stop shopping when it comes to arranging entertainment like the wagon train dinner and other area activities, so our guests can sit back and enjoy the ride.”

Summer room rates at the Wyoming Inn start from \$199/night. Additional charges for the Wagon Train Dinner, including covered wagon travel and entertainment, are \$43 per person, adults; \$36, children 5-12; and free for kids under 5.
